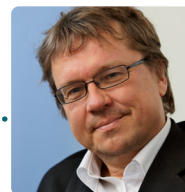

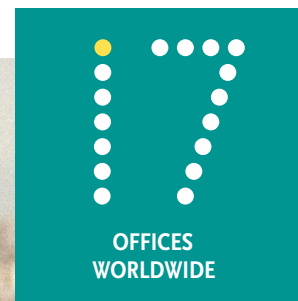
ICLEI – Local Governments for Sustainability is a global network of local and regional governments committed to sustainable development.
