Making the Deal:



The city of Aalborg in Denmark is creating a Climate Alliance with local companies aiming to lower CO2 emissions. The municipality's ambitious climate plan contributes to the national goal to lower greenhouse gas emissions by 70% by 2030 compared to 1990, and to become climate neutral by 2050.



One of the world's largest manufacturers of nonwoven fabrics used in the hygiene industry (e.g. for baby diapers) with headquarters in Aalborg. The company has already started making their energy management and transport of products and raw materials more sustainable, and is the first ISCC+ certified manufacturer in their field.

The Commitments:

Fibertex Personal Care A/S commits to:

- Work to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from energy consumption to zero by 2030
- Explore the sale of waste heat to district heating, in collaboration with Aalborg Municipality and the municipal utility company
- Influence its customers and suppliers by providing expertise and setting environmental requirements for suppliers
- Participate actively in the establishment and operation of a pilot project on waste management with other production companies in the region
- Contribute to networking and knowledge sharing, e.g., on the platforms and forums provided by Aalborg Municipality

Aalborg Municipality commits to:

- Support the regulatory processing of applications for the establishment of plants that result in climate reductions
- Support the identification of opportunities for the sale of waste heat to district heating
- Support the dialogue, and possibly a pilot project, on waste management with other production companies in the region
- Arrange networking events across industries for companies
- Communicate Fibertex Personal Care A/S' climate performance on relevant platforms

The agreement is reassessed on an ongoing basis and at least every two years.

Kunsten

Kunsten Museum attracts over 100,000 visitors annually with exhibitions, lectures, concerts, workshops, and tours. Renovated from 2014 to 2016 for better energy efficiency, the museum has been certified as a Green Attraction, reflecting its commitment to sustainability. Since 2020, Kunsten Museum has partnered with the Center for Green Transition to further adopt eco-friendly practices. These include improved recycling and reusing exhibition materials. Their restaurant, Brasserie Kunsten, focuses on locally sourced, eco-friendly food. The museum also promotes sustainability and climate awareness through its exhibitions and talks, while enhancing building efficiency and collaborating with local and national partners to reduce transport costs.

The Commitments:

Kunsten Museum is committed to advancing sustainability through several key initiatives. They will begin by conducting a thorough environmental and climate assessment, based on a workshop with key employees at Kunsten Sommer Lounge. Following this, Kunsten will prepare climate accounting in line with Greenhouse Gas (GHG) protocol principles, ensuring that the data collected for Scope 1 and 2 emissions meets their expectations.

From the results of the screening workshop and climate accounting, Kunsten will develop a detailed action plan outlining specific sustainability initiatives. They will also create a sustainability vision and define three core initiatives to guide their efforts. Additionally, Kunsten will stay up-to-date with technological advancements to continually improve and optimize the building's sustainability in areas such as electricity, water, heating, and CO2 emissions. They are also committed to exploring and applying for external funding to support further climate-related projects. To raise awareness and educate the public, Kunsten will integrate discussions on climate, sustainability, and the World Goals into their exhibitions, talks, guided tours, and creative workshops.

In turn, **Aalborg Municipality will support Kunsten's efforts** by organizing network events to inspire and facilitate new partnerships across various industries. The Municipality will provide guidance on climate and sustainability matters, including helping Kunsten find funding opportunities. They will also assist in calculating potential CO2 reductions and will present Kunsten's climate results on relevant platforms.
